At Key Stage Three, homework is used to:

- consolidate learning and understanding;
- provide opportunities for independent study;
- allow pupils to respond creatively to topics and tasks set within class;
- develop core study skills;
- encouraging pupils to take responsibility for their own learning and progress.

At Parkside, children in KS3 should complete 45-60 minutes homework per night, as well as reading for 20 minutes at least three times per week (as part of the Accelerated Reader programme). For carousel subjects, pupils will be set homework which links directly to the subject in the carousel that they are studying and this subject will change every ten weeks. The children will be set a Science project at the start of each half term.

Please note that the children may receive some extra homework occasionally if teachers feel it is necessary for reasons such as completion of tasks.
