Despite fantastic efforts from our team, Witton scored 2 out of their 3 penalties crowning them winners of the tournament. However, the team should be proud of their results and the way that they collaborated as a team. A special mention to our goalkeeper who was a credit to the school, showcasing some fantastic goalkeeping skills and keeping three clean sheets across the group stages. Well done!



YEAR 7 TRIP TO WARWICK CASTLE

Year 7 enjoyed a fantastic trip to Warwick castle on Thursday 29th September. Pupils got to experience battle skills, they climbed the towers and when they reached the top saw the fantastic views of Warwick. They learnt about the history of the castle and discovered how it was built and what castle life was like throughout the years. We also enjoyed the falcon show where we saw birds with wingspans up to 9 foot and witnessed the bowman demonstrating how bows and arrows were used to defend the castle. The trip was a huge success and enjoyed by all.



YEAR 6 TRIP TO BLACK COUNTRY MUSEUM

On Friday 14th October, Year 6 went on a Humanities trip to the Black Country Museum. The pupils saw history brought to life as they participated in a Victorian school lesson, met historical characters who showed them what it was like to live and work in the first industrialised landscapes in Britain and explored reconstructed shops, workplaces and houses. The pupils had many questions throughout the day and fully embraced all that the museum had to offer.

YEAR 8 STEM WORKSHOP

Year 8 had the chance to take part in a series of STEM workshops run by the Sea Cadets with a particular focus on Marine Engineering. During the workshops, children learned about buoyancy, calculated density, how to change an items density and The Archimedes Principle. They were challenged to build their own boat before finally competing against each other to see which had the best buoyancy.
