

PARKSIDE MIDDLE SCHOOL ANTI-BULLYING POLICY

BULLYING IS REPEATED NEGATIVE BEHAVIOUR THAT IS INTENDED TO MAKE OTHERS FEEL UPSET, UNCOMFORTABLE OR UNSAFE.
BULLYING IS UNACCEPTABLE BEHAVIOUR.



WHAT IS BULLYING?

For someone to be bullied it has to have happened several times on purpose.
 Bullying is intentional (not an accident) and repetitive.
 A bully hurts someone on purpose repeatedly; it isn't an incident that happens only once. Bullying can be by one person or a group of people.



WHAT ARE THE MAIN TYPES OF BULLYING?

Physical Bullying

- ·Hitting
- Smacking
- ·Kicking
- ·Punching
- ·Or any physical contact that is harmful

<u>Verbal Bullying</u>

- ·Name calling
- ·Threats
- ·Offensive remarks
- Insulting someone because of their religion, skin colour or background

Indirect Bullying

- ·Spreading nasty stories about someone
- ·Gossiping and leaving someone out from social groups
- ·Stopping someone from having a happy time at school

Cyber Bullying

- ·Sending nasty e-mails
- Sending nasty texts
- ·Making nasty phone calls

Sexual Bullying

- ·Unwanted physical contact/inappropriate touching
- Sexual name calling





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WHAT WE DO TO PREVENT BULLYING:

- We will do our best to prevent bullying by providing clear and consistent messages to staff and all pupils regarding expectations at Parkside Middle School.
- We will not ignore any incidents of bullying.
- We will ensure that all staff in the school are educated to spot the common signs and indicators of bullying and how to deal with bullying.
- We will make sure all pupils are aware of our Anti-Bullying Policy and The Parkside Standard.
- We will make it simple for students to report incidents of bullying for example talking to an adult or using the <u>"Speak-up button"</u> on our school website.
- We will educate students about joking behaviour or 'banter' which can be perceived as bullying.
- We will signpost pupils to support such as the school's welfare and well-being team or other organisations and support groups.
- We will challenge casual discriminatory language or 'slurs' and will ensure that this is dealt with according to the school's Positive Behaviour, Attitudes and Relationship policy.



The Parkside Standards

Our school community should all adhere to our school ethos and values. We should uphold the five Parkside Standards. These standards are non-negotiable.

- We will keep ourselves and each other safe.
- We will work as a team always showing politeness, kindness and respect.
- We will always try our best and take pride in everything we do.
- We will wear the correct uniform with pride.
- We will be prepared and organised for the school day.



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What to do if you think you are being bullied?

The first thing to do is tell a responsible adult that you trust such as a teacher, learning support assistant, a lunchtime supervisor or parent/carer. The staff at school will always take you seriously and sort out the problem. If you see someone being bullied, be a good friend to them and encourage them to do the right thing by telling an adult. If they are too scared, then you should tell a responsible adult immediately. Never join in! If you are not sure, speak to a responsible adult so that they can find out what is going on.





What could happen to the person doing the bullying?

- Apologise to the victim verbally or in writing
- Lose privileges
- Lose part of a break/lunchtime
- Parents/Carers invited into school
- Go on behaviour report card for an appropriate period
- Be removed from the classroom
- Report to the Headteacher, Deputy
 Headteacher or Assistant Headteachers
- Be withdrawn from participation in school visit, clubs and events or other extra-curricular activities
- Suspension
- Permanent exclusion
