The IET Faraday® Challenge Days are cross-curricular activity days covering Science, Design and Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM). They are held at schools, organisations and universities around the UK.

The students taking part had the opportunity to research real-life engineering problems. They had a great day coming up with designs and solutions to these problems and learning about how engineering is relevant in many situations.

We were first taken by a tour guide to a model praying room where she explained some of the basic ideas within Sikhism and then went into detail about some of the more well-known practices. She then led us to the main hall of the building where people pray to God and traditional Sikh songs are sung. You are encouraged to give a donation to the gurdwara, as it is run by the community and must pay for the langar (meal). Finally, we were given a taste of some of the food that Sikhs eat, such as chapatis and curry.

ATTENDANCE

The Department for Education have recently launched a campaign to raise awareness of the importance of school attendance, highlighting the benefits beyond just attainment, such as friendships and well-being. Here at Parkside we believe that regular school attendance is important for your child's learning, but also for their overall wellbeing, wider development and mental health.

We understand that for parents and carers it can be difficult to know when to send your child in to school if they are feeling unwell. It is usually safe for children to attend school with mild illnesses, like a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat. However children should stay at home if they have a high temperature of 38° or above.

The NHS has published guidance to help parents and carers decide whether their child is well enough to attend school. This includes information on a range of common childhood illnesses and conditions such as coughs, colds, chicken pox and headlice. See the below link to access this information.

As a school we are committed to working in partnership with parents and carers to ensure that children are supported to attend school and reach their full potential. Please ensure that absences are reported by 09:00am and we ask that you contact us **EVERY** day your child is unwell. Any unreported absences are marked as unauthorised on your child's attendance report.

We would like to remind all parents and carers of the importance of children attending school on time. Our rear gate to the playground closes at 08:50am to ensure that all children are in registration ready to start their day promptly. If you are running late for any reason, please contact the school office.
