

Parkside Middle School - 2025 Frequently Asked Transition Questions

Below is a selection of questions we are frequently asked by year 4 pupils, with our answers. I hope they are useful and stop you worrying about your move to middle school! Mrs Papadopoulos •

What happens if I get lost?

Expect to get lost at least once, most new staff do too! The most important thing is not to worry. Your form tutor will take you on a school tour in the first week. Also, there are staff all over the building and lots of helpful pupils from other year groups. Just ask and you will be ok.

If I'm worried about something, what do I do?

Everyone worries about things now and again. Make sure you speak to someone if you are worried. Your class-teacher is the best person. Each class also has a 'Share Box', so you can always write it down your worries if you prefer. Just don't keep it to yourself, as that often makes it worse!

Will I be in a class with other children from my first school?

You will have some children from your first school with you in your class. Larger cohorts will be split between the 5 classes, smaller cohorts will be either split between a couple of classes or kept together.

Will I be with the same teacher all day?

You are more class-based in year 5 than any other year group and will have quite a few lessons with your class-teacher. However, you may have some lessons with different teachers e.g. PE and computing

Will all my lessons be with my class?

You will have all lessons with your class, apart from Maths and English, where you will be taught in smaller groups. You are still likely to be with some pupils from your class and previous first school. It's a good way of meeting new people and making new friends!

How do I find the right room for my lesson?

All the rooms are numbered and it is written outside every classroom. You will be collected to start with if you need to get to another room. Don't worry, as pupils in year 6, 7 and 8 will also be trying to find the right room in September and staff will be around to direct you to the right room. Remember if you are worried, just ask!

What happens if I need the toilet?

If you need the toilet in a lesson you must ask. Toilets for year 5 are upstairs by the main staircase. We do try to discourage you using toilets in the middle of a lesson, as it disrupts your learning. Try to go at break or lunchtime if you can.

How do I know what lessons I've got?

You will be given a copy of your timetable to stick to the back of your Pupil Handbook when you start Parkside. This will tell you what lessons you have each day, the room and the teacher. Most year 5 classes also display a visual timetable for each day.

Will the work be hard when I move to middle school?

The work will be a bit harder when you move to middle school, but no different to moving from year 3 to 4 in your first school. It would be really boring to cover the same work at the same level again! Just remember to ask if you are struggling, so your teacher can help you in that lesson or try using your Pupil Handbook and the displays around the room to help you.

What can I eat at break-time?

At break-time, you can bring your own healthy snack which you will eat on the year 5 playground. We do not like pupils eating sweets in school.

Where do I eat my lunch?

If you have sandwiches, you will eat in one of the year 5 classrooms. If you order a dinner from BAM you will eat in the dinner hall/canteen. In the Summer, you will be able to picnic on the school field if you bring your own sandwiches or order a fast-track sandwich meal.

How do I get into school?

The pupil entrance into school is from the public walkway, which splits the school from the MUGA and school field. The gates open at 8:30am. Parents/carers can meet you in the walkway at the end of the day, but it is better to meet at either end as it can get a bit crowded!

What kind of trips will I go on at Parkside?

There are lots of different trips organised in school, they are not the same every year, but will link to your learning. In year 5, you might visit the pantomime at Christmas and Blackwell Outdoor Adventure Centre. We also have Inspiration Days and events like Rock Star Day, Art in a Day or Neurodiversity Day to enjoy!

What happens if I get stuck on my homework?

Most homework is set with a week to complete, it is important that you speak to your teacher for help, before the work is due to be handed in. Try using your Pupil Handbook for help. There is a daily Homework Club that runs at lunchtime if you need time to do your homework or help from a teacher. If you have worked really hard at home for 30 minutes and have not finished, ask a parent to write a quick note or email to your teacher. Some homework will be on computer, so make sure you have all your logins written down or stuck into your Pupil Handbook!

Am I allowed to bring a mobile phone to school?

You are allowed to bring a mobile phone, but all pupils must hand them in to their form tutors at the start of the day. The office will keep them locked away throughout the day and return them before you go home.

Where will I keep my stuff?

You will keep your bag and stuff with you at all times, so think about this when you choose your school bag. You will be given a locker or peg to keep your coat and PE kit in.

Do I need a lock for my locker?

Lockers will only be used for coats in winter and to store your PE or swimming kit. No valuables will be kept in your locker, so no lock is needed.

What should I take into class?

In a morning, you will need to take your Pupil Handbook, pencil case and reading book into class and then to every lesson. You should have in your pencil case: a pencil, handwriting pen, green pen, ruler, rubber and pencil sharpener. Your own whiteboard pen and a set of wired headphones is really useful too! It is also a good idea to have an A4 zip folder to carry everything around in.

Can I wear my PE Kit to school?

PE kit can be worn to school on PE days. If you attend an after-school club on a non-PE day, you must bring your kit to change into, so you may wish to store it in your locker during the day.

Will I get a detention?

Just because you are moving to middle school doesn't mean you are suddenly going to start getting detentions! Detentions at Parkside are very rare! All schools, like your first school, have rules and Parkside is no different. If you are amazing and work really hard (which I know you will) there will be lots of rewards. If you don't follow the rules or don't work hard, there will be sanctions. Rewards and sanctions will be explained to you when you start Parkside – most will be similar to your first school!

Can I wear anything in my hair?

All hair accessories need to be small and plain. We do not allow large colourful accessories like giant bows and flower headbands – save these for weekends!

How long will it take me to settle into middle school?

Most of you will settle into middle school life, by the end of the first week! A few of you will take a bit longer, don't worry about this — everyone is different and you will eventually settle! We'll continue to help you with this. Let us know, if you are finding the move to middle school difficult.

If after reading these FAQ you are still worried about something, make sure you write it into your 'Moving on' Transition Booklet. Your question will then be answered by your class-teacher on your Induction Day in September. We can answer most things!
